

## HB 140/SB 56: Election Law - Petitions and Ballot Questions - Plain Language Requirement

Requires petitions and ballot questions be written in plain language - a reading level no higher than 6<sup>th</sup> grade.

## What are the benefits:

- > promotes inclusion for people with intellectual disabilities
- > supports others that may not be able to read above a 6<sup>th</sup> grade level
- promotes a better understanding of what is being voting on

HB 142: Election Law - Voting Order Priority - Individuals Who Need Extra
Assistance

Allows election judges to create a voting order priority so people with mobility disabilities, people providing assistance to a person with a mobility disabilities, and people with young children can go to the front of the line. In addition, the bill:

- Allows someone to request a voting order priority
- Requires training guidelines be established for election judges
- > Requries notice of the option to request voting order priority to voters before an election and at each polling place on election day
