Rules:

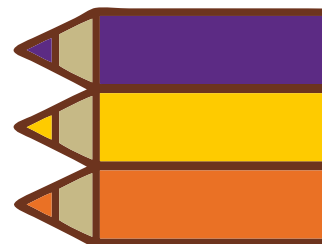
- Submission should be done by one student.

- Artwork including photographs of students must be accompanied by a release form signed by the parent/legal guardian of the child pictured.

- Follows to the National Inclusive Schools Week theme: "Unity Within Our Community."
- Creativity and Originality.
- Use of Materials / Supplies.
