- A completed copy of the entry form must be submitted with the art.
- Artwork must be accompanied by a release form signed by the parent/legal guardian.
- Students should write their names on the back of their submission.

The top three submissions, as selected by contest judges, will receive prizes for themselves and their schools! All winners will also be invited to our Awards Celebration at Developmental Disabilities Day at the Legislature on February 21, 2024! Submissions may also be displayed online and in public displays across Maryland!
